Breaking Barriers, Bridging Divides: Gender Equality and Empowerment Symposium

The Center for Sustainable Development Goals and the E Women Global Network of COPAIR and International Relations, in collaboration with the National Commission of the Status of Women, recently organized a Round Table Conference titled "Breaking Barriers, Bridging Divides: Gender Equality and Empowerment Symposium" at the COPAIR Head Office. The primary aim of this significant dialogue was to concentrate on women's empowerment and the essential task of closing existing gaps. In Pakistan, where women make up 48.4 percent of the population, the pursuit of gender equality is not just a moral obligation but a crucial element of sustainable development.

It entails providing tools, resources, and platforms necessary for individuals, particularly women, to shape their destinies, contribute meaningfully to society, and engage in decision-making processes. Achieving genuine gender equality and empowerment necessitates not only a policy framework but also a societal transformation. This is why participants from diverse fields were invited to the Round Table Conference to share their perspectives, evaluate past and present gender policies, and establish a data source for gender statistics.

- **Bridging Gender Divides:** Discussing challenges and propose measures to bridge existing divides in gender equality.
- **Policy Evaluation:** Analyzing the effectiveness of past and current gender-related policies in Pakistan.
- Strategic Partnerships for Progress: Forging collaborative efforts to develop a comprehensive understanding of gender dynamics, enabling evidence-based policymaking and fostering collective action towards advancing gender equality.


